
Adding Sound To Adobe .PDF Files

This is the best practice for adding sound to Adobe .PDFs; you <u>cannot</u> add .WAV files to Adobe. When recording save it as .**MP3 not .WAV.** This is helpful because:

- Sound files are very large, especially .WAV
- Adding sound into .PDF (are preferred way of sending client documents), opens the recording in a small window on the page with document. Before it would open in a large window in Internet Explorer

NOTE: Do not have spaces in filename (AnalyzingAcctProcessing or Analyzing Acct Process)

- After you have completed the work document and added the icon for sound, open Adobe Acrobat Pro then select Create PDF and select the Word document (.DOC) to convert to .PDF
 NOTE: If you do not have it speak with Jamie for installation instructions and key#
- 2. Select **Tools** > **Multimedia** > **Sound**, then use cursor to *draw box* around headphones icon



3. In Sound window select Advance Options check box then populate as seen below:
